

WHAT TO TELL US WHEN YOU MAKE AN APPLICATION

1. The name of your group or organisation
2. It's purpose (if not clear from Item 1)
3. It's operating base
4. What the donation is required for
5. The approximate number of people who will benefit directly from the facility being provided, if under 20 persons
6. The approximate sum you require to fund the whole, or specified part, of the project or item of equipment

You can apply for a Charitable Donation at any time of the year; all applications must be made in writing.

All applications will be considered - the major distribution of donations for the year is decided approximately six weeks after the Evening Carnival.

Cheques are presented early in the New Year.

From time to time, emergency donations may be made in the course of a year should funds still be available and a pressing need arises.

**Your application must be received
by 31 October 2011**

We regret that any non-urgent requests received after this date cannot be considered until after Carnival 2011.

Applications must be received by 31st October 2011

ELIGIBLE GROUPS AND ORGANISATIONS

1. Donations will be made primarily to groups whose operating base falls within a 5 mile radius of Castle Cary Market House. Exceptions might be Somerset-based projects (which include benefits to our parishes) such as The Air Ambulance, St Margaret's Hospice, etc.
2. Other than in exceptional circumstances, donations will be made to fund, wholly or partly, specified projects or items of equipment of a permanent or semi-permanent nature, and not to meet everyday running expenses.
3. Wherever possible, the Society expects a donation to be recognised appropriately by the recipient body - in the form of a simple permanent plaque or notice. The Society will bear the cost of such acknowledgments over and above the award being made, unless the recipient body makes specific requirements as to design, materials, etc.
4. Donations will be awarded directly to the named recipient and not through an intermediary organisation.
5. Donations will not normally be made to private businesses or organisations.
6. The Society has discretion to make awards to local branches of national charitable organisations and public service groups where they have made a specific or essential contribution to the running of Carnival. For example, St. John's Ambulance, and some benevolent funds fall into this category.
